## Creature movie song video

Who ran the world? How about a Beyoncé-style 50Ft Woman attack? The singer/woman of active clothing/ruler of the world is just one of many musical artists to have their songs transformed into grindhouse movie posters. MusiXploitation is a series of movie posters that exist only in the hearts of rabid fans. In the late 1990s, Master P would release narrative feature films with the same titles as his albums, which were a kind of fictional precursor to Lemonade with some seriously fraught dialogue. This new series is a look at the world where that practice has taken stock with the entire music industry. Created by Parisian artistic director David Redon, the series features blaxploitation-style posters for songs and albums by Amy Winehouse, 2Pac and Jay-z. (Previously, Redon had crushed musicians with vintage ads.) Some are thematically appropriate, such as Frank Ocean's Galactic Pyramids and Ghosts, and others would no doubt make their mymes so upset, such as the Miseducation of Lauryn Hill turned into a bikini bank robbery caper. Like the recent covers of Quentin Tarantino's books on Co.Create, some of the rumors are ruined by almost comically shoddy photoshop.
